
What is HLF?

Valuing our heritage, investing in our future.

Using money raised through the National Lottery, the Heritage Lottery Fund gives grants to sustain and transform our heritage.

In 2012/13 HLF has to distribute in London:

- £15.2million approx in total
- £3million approx for Your Heritage grants
- £122,000 for All Our Stories grants
- £488,000 for Young Roots grants

Our grants programmes

- **All Our Stories- £3,000-£10,000**
 - Simpler application process
 - Limited time frame
- **Young Roots - £3,000 - £50,000**
 - Young People aged 11-25
 - Projects lasting up to two years
 - Heritage partner
- **Your Heritage – £3,000 - £100,000**
- **Heritage Grants – over £100,000**

Project example

Last year, Hadleigh Sea Scouts in Suffolk were awarded just over £8k to research life from the 30s and 40s.

Working with a local museum, the young people wrote, produced and performed a community play based on what they had discovered.


